

Handwashing art

You will need:

- Butchers paper or large poster paper
- Child safe paint blue and white
- Plates or dishes for the paint
- Soap
- Small round sponges for stamping/printing 'soap bubbles' onto the hand prints



Steps:

- 1. Discuss the importance of washing your hands with soap and warm water before and after you eat, after the toilet and after playing outside.
- 2. Using the child safe paint, help each child to make a blue hand print on the poster paper.
- 3. Above or around the hand prints, write the message wash your hands with soap and warm water.
- 4. Once the hand prints are dry, using the small round sponges, allow the children to press the round sponges into the white paint and stamp/print round white 'soap bubbles' onto the hand prints. Display the poster to remind children to wash their hands regularly.

Extension: Encourage the children to practice washing their hands whilst singing 'Happy Birthday' twice to demonstrate how long it takes to wash their hands properly.
