Making every drop count

After last year's dry summer, it's natural to wonder what this one will bring. In Greater Melbourne, anything's possible!

Whatever the weather, it's important to continue finding ways to save precious drinking water. Our climate is drying and less water is flowing into our storages than we need to support a growing population.

Every drop counts and we all have a part to play so there's enough water for everyone, now and into the future.

The Victorian Government's Permanent Water Saving Rules are always in place to help us all use drinking water wisely. For businesses, the rules cover everyday activities like:

- washing vehicles or equipment with a high-pressure cleaning device, bucket or hose fitted with a trigger nozzle (and no leaks)
- watering plants with a watering can or hose, or with watering systems between 6pm and 10am
- cleaning driveways, paths or buildings with a high-pressure cleaning device, bucket or hose once each season (or anytime if it's for safety, health or an emergency)
- running fountains or water features only if the water is recirculated.

These simple habits help protect Victoria's precious supply every day.
